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BEYOND THE STATE BOUNDARIES

State level Kala Utsav for school students was organized on the theme "Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat" (EBSB) depicting the state of Sikkim in Delhi. EBSB scheme, an initiative of Ministry of Human Resource Development, is a novel approach to create an environment which promotes learning between states by sharing best practices and experiences. The aim is to showcase the rich heritage and culture, customs and traditions of other states for enabling people to understand and appreciate the diversity in India. This exchange programmes underscore the unity of cultures while celebrating diversity. Under the scheme, NCT of Delhi has been paired with Sikkim for the year 2016-17.

The Utsav promotes art in education by nurturing and showcasing the artistic talent of school students at the secondary stage in the country through music, theatre, dance, visual arts and crafts. Over 4235 students from 750 schools participated in the competition. Out of these, 547 were from Government schools, 41 Government aided and

A short cultural event was also organised on this occasion wherein the ANDC students hailing from the NE presented group songs and other performances.

School of Vocational Studies at AUD

“The Vocational Programme in Early Childhood Centre Management and Entrepreneurship (ECCME) will address the age group of 0-6 years, which has not been addressed even in the Right to Education Act”, said Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia while launching the School of Vocational Studies at the Ambedkar University of Delhi, Karampura Campus, on October 16. The treatment meted out to our children of this age group has a bearing on the future citizenry which decides the status and prospects of the Nation, he added.

The BVoc degree programmes offered are in Tourism and Hospitality, Retail Management and the Early Childhood Centre Management and Entrepreneurship. The highlights of these programmes are that it has multi entry and multi exit options

available to the students. The curriculum has been designed in close partnership with industry experts, industry association like Retailers Association of India, sector skill council like Tourism and Hospitality Sector Skill Council (THSC), institutions like the Centre for Early Childhood Education and Development (CECED, AUD), and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Pravah, The Ferdinand Centre, as well as academicians. The curricula of the programmes have been designed keeping in mind the current trends as well as the future scenario to ensure that the programmes are dynamic and relevant for its main purposes — employability and entrepreneurship.

The School of Vocational Studies (SVS), as envisaged, has explored and developed programmes and courses that will provide students with the required academic background and skill-set for meaningful employment once they graduate from the programme. It is hoped that these programmes would enable many of the students to become self-employed, entrepreneurs, creators and generators of job for themselves and for many more educated youth in the society.

In his welcome address, Prof Shayam B Menon, Vice Chancellor, said that there has to be an organic linkage between the City of Delhi and the Ambedkar University. The City has wide heterogeneous population consisting also of semi rural population and there is a need to understand the interface between the students and the job market as well as space for social entrepreneurship. The aim is not to flood the job market but to create job for others as well. The student should not just manage

wealth of others rather they should be able to create wealth for themselves too. The concept of SVS and its three pilot BVoc programmes aim at addressing these concerns.

Ms Punya Salila Srivastava, Secretary, Education, complimented the University for being able to materialise the idea of skill development which the government has been contemplating in the recent past. GGSIPU has developed the vocational programmes in technical fields and AUD has designed the vocational course in the area of social sciences and humanities, she added.

COMMUNICATION THROUGH THEATRE

Acharya Narendra Dev College conducted the ninth batch of short-term add-on course on “Effective Communication and Personality Development through Theatre”. The course started in the month of August, came to an end on October 17 with brilliant and enthusiastic performances by students of the course. This year, the course had 34 students as participants and several eminent theatre personalities as Resource Persons.

The course is inspired by, and seeks to implement UNICEF and WHO's internationally recognized vision of life skills based education. The course seeks to hone in students skills such as effective communication, dynamic leadership through problem solving, critical thinking and decision-making, ability to think creatively and act confidently through acting, improvisations, performances and scripting, teamwork and interpersonal relationship skills focusing on relationships with the self, friends and family, and society, and self-management and self-awareness building skills through effective conflict management, negotiations and the ability to cope with stress and manage time effectively.

Dr Nivedita Deo, Professor, Department of Physics & Astrophysics, University of Delhi (Member, Governing Body, ANDC) was the Chief Guest at the culmination function. An exhibition was organized in which students showcased their creative and imaginative skills. Students enacted situations given to them on-the-spot by the audience.

Dr Savithri Singh, Principal of the college spoke about excellent performances by all students and how students' personalities have been groomed through the course during previous batches. Professor Nivedita Deo emphasised that such courses are very important part of education as they let students come out with their inner thoughts and thus improve their creative skills.

Incubation & Sports Pharmacy Centre at DPSRU

The first Sports Pharmacy Centre 'ASSRM' and the Incubation Centre at Delhi Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research University (DPSRU), Saket was inaugurated on October 17 by the Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia. DPSRU is the first University in India dedicated to the Pharmaceutical Sciences and perhaps second in the World with around 1000 students on roll.

DPSRU is perhaps the first in the world to start a degree course in Sports Pharmacy with 80 students admitted in the very first year. The Academy of Sports Science and Research Management (ASSRM), First Sports Pharmacy Centre provides the requisite support in terms of nutrition, psychology, medicine, pharmacology, physiology, biomechanics as well as other branches of sports sciences. This academy can help students in achieving their dreams to work in the sport industry, thereby resulting in the growth of the overall sports industry in India.

Sharing his vision, Dy CM said, "We expect DPSRU to be established as a model pharmacy centre in the world, which would identify and bridge the gap in the drug industry. Research and innovations should be its top priority. A lot of money has been invested on institutions like DPSRU, and the pass out students needs to think as to what it can give it back to the society."

Education Secretary Ms Punya Salila Srivastava said that right from the inception of the University, the expectations have been high and the way the building has come up, new courses introduced, intake capacity increased and the way research is progressing, it is commendable.

This University became functional by the Government of NCT of Delhi on 22nd September 2015 with Delhi Institute of

Mercedes Benz to run the course at GB Pant IoT

India's largest luxury car manufacturer Mercedes Benz India will run a one-year Advance Diploma in Automotive Mechatronics (ADAM) at Delhi Govt run GB Pant Institute of Technology to educate the Delhi youth with the latest technology making them employable. The course will prepare the youth with expertise in mechanical, electronics and informatics as well as in other modern automation technologies.

Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia exchanged the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to this effect with Managing Director & CEO, Mercedes-Benz India Ltd (MBIL), Roland Folger at Delhi Secretariat on October 25. "The Delhi government is making all efforts to bring in the best of global companies to impart knowledge and provide hands on experience to our students so that they do not lag behind with any of their competitors in the market", said Manish Sisodia.

The Mechatronics training school at Mercedes-Benz India was started in 2002 with the aim of providing trained service personnel and engineers. "India has a large youth demographic which gives the country a unique edge over other markets. However, to sustain this competitive edge, there is an urgent requirement to make this educated youth, skilled, employable and ready for the industry. We have taken this initiative to make sure that India's youth are prepared with the right skill set and knowledge to face new challenges and conquer them," said Roland Folger.

To start with, only 20 students per centre qualify to take the course every year. The one year ADAM course will contain basics of Automobile Engineering, Electrical & Electronics Technology, advance automobile systems, its diagnosis, practical hands on experience on MB car, MBIL factory visit etc. The course shall be conducted in English language. Minimum eligibility criteria for pursuing the course is Diploma (10+3)/BTech or B.E., followed by an entrance test.

Initially for the first batch, a specialist trainer from MBIL shall visit GBPIT for three days in each quarter for supporting the smooth conduct of ADAM course whose expenses shall be fully borne by MBIL. Minimum of two members of regular faculty of the GBPIT shall be trained in the course at MBIL initially for minimum nine months under the supervision of MBIL specialist trainer. For every candidate a maximum of two repeat/supplementary attempts to pass the ADAM course will be allowed.

Under the MoU, MBIL will donate one unit of Mercedes Benz car for training along with training engines, gearboxes, training components and other special tools required for training aggregates will be provided by MBIL for training purposes. The comprehensive course most likely shall commence from academic year 2017-2018.
