

### Raise your self-esteem & volunteer to give up quota : Wangchuk 568 AWARDED DEGREES AT AMBEDKAR UNIVERSITY

Over 568 students were awarded with PhD, MPhil, MBA, MA, BA (Hons) Degrees during the 6th annual convocation ceremony of Ambedkar University Delhi held on December 8.

Innovator and education reformist Sonam Wangchuk addressing the ceremony said that people who have benefitted from reservation or quota in education should voluntarily give up their status as they should consider themselves "equal". He said this will allow other people from the weaker sections to benefit from the reservation system and will reach the people who are weaker than them.

Wangchuk, who inspired Aamir Khan's character in the acclaimed movie 3 Idiots after he initiated reforms in school education in Ladakh, said, "I belong to the ST category, but I have not had to take up benefits of it".

Appreciating the innovative and path breaking courses of AUD, he stressed the importance for a country like India to take the lead in guiding the world in new directions in education. He said that the western model of education, which India is also following, is now leading the planet towards ecological and social breakdown. The education should be able to create a world which is more sane, compassionate and caring. He said that the present modal of education was launched in a different era for a different purpose, when the assumption was that nature could be conquered and production and consumption was the ultimate aim.

He stressed that learning does not take place in institutions only, and taking a break in life may make us wiser. Our education system is obsessed with grades, degrees and rituals, and does not provide enough space for stepping back and reflecting on social concerns and problems.

Students comprised from various fields of studies such as Business Administration, Design, Development Studies/Practice, Economics, Education, English, Environment & Development, Film Studies, Hindi, History, Human Ecology, Literary Art, Mathematics, Performance

Studies, Psychology, Social Sciences & Humanities, Sociology, Visual Art and Women's & Gender Studies. Post Graduate Diplomas in Development Studies, Early Childhood Care & Education and Environment & Development were also awarded. The breakup of the students who received their Degrees and Diplomas included: BA (Hons) – 161; MA – 342; MBA – 38; MPhil – 13; PG Diploma – 7 and PhD – 7 (Total = 568). Of the 568 graduating students female students constituted 65%.

Delhi Lieutenant Governor Anil Baijal said that among the educational institutions of the city, AUD stands out for its rapid growth, world class

faculty and innovative programmes and curricula. He expressed the urgent need for the country's education system to be in sync with changing times, with increased focus on experiential learning and critical thinking. He advised students to follow their passion and to travel and gain new experiences. Citing the examples of Gautam Buddha, Mahatma Gandhi and Mother Teresa, he highlighted the importance of

withdrawing periodically from the pressures of work to journey within oneself to contribute better to the world. He wished all the graduating students a very bright future.

Highlighting the past achievements of the University, the Vice Chancellor, Prof Shyam Menon shared that AUD is entering in new areas of education and catering to new target groups. The University has launched BVoc and MA in Law Politics and Society in the present Academic Year at its Karampura Campus. The University is about to launch a programmes in Global Studies, Urban Studies and Public Policy. Similarly an MPhil programme in Disability Studies is also on the anvil. The University will also be conducting English Language Certificate Programme for aspirants of higher education, particularly for students of government schools. An integrated BA & BEd programme will soon be offered from the Lodhi Road campus. He concluded by saying that there will be much more to report in the Seventh Convocation. ■

## “Education should not be treated as silos of learning”

Delhi Lieutenant Governor Anil Baijal urged technology institutes to teach basic social sciences to students too as part of curriculum so that education is not treated as silos of learning. Baijal was addressing the fourth convocation of Delhi Technological University on December 15. Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia, 'Metro man' E Sreedharan also took part in the event.

"For too long university teaching has dished out courses that have treated education as silos of learning. When times have changed, an interdisciplinary courses that broaden the learning base should be an essential component for a balanced learning," Baijal, who is also the chancellor of the Varsity, said. "Nobody can dispute that major objective of all learning in education is in someway or the other an attempt to resolve issues of humanities," he said.

Manish Sisodia advised the students to sustain the existing good things and develop new technology. He mentioned the Delhi Government's policy of providing "matching grant" for promoting new research and development ideas at par with the industry.

Dr E Sreedharan advised the students to follow two golden rules for success in life. While quoting from Bhagwadgita he said, "You must perform all tasks with commitment and without attachment. Secondly, duties must be performed with the spirit of offering to the almighty. He also emphasized the importance of health and good character".

The Vice Chancellor presented the University Report for the year 2016-17 and congratulated the degree and medal recipients. He highlighted the achievements of the university in the past year and urged the students to always remember their responsibilities towards Mother Nature and Nation. He said, "Remember to come back to India, not only because India needs you but also because you will need India in the times to come".

On this occasion a book on biography of the five illustrious alumni of Delhi Technological University was also released. The book titled "Because the Sky is The Limit" is authored by Vinit K Bansal. The book highlights the life stories of some of the most eminent personalities who are alumni of the university and have achieved a big name for themselves and the country. This book incorporates the life stories of inspiration, grit and determination of superlative achievers like Vijay Shekhar Sharma, Group Captain RS Bhola, Karnal Singh, Durgadas Agrawal and Arun Goyal ■

## Alumni on a 'Feeding India' Mission KESHAV MAHAVIDYALAYA

Ankit Kwatra, alumni of Keshav Mahavidyalaya, quit his well-paid job and a flourishing career at an MNC at the age of 22 to feed the hungry and make India a food-waste free nation with his startup 'FEEDING INDIA'.

It all started when Ankit, attended a grand wedding where there were over 35 cuisines. He wondered what would happen to so much of food left over and decided to stay back. He witnessed heaps of excess food being sent straight to the bin which could have fed over 5,000 people just that night. This gave a spark in his life to feed the poor and hungry.

Ankit made a humble beginning and started with a team of just 5 people in August 2014 but by virtue of his strong will & determination he went on to develop a network of more than 7500 volunteers in 50 cities who joined this convincing movement. In a short span of time, 'Feeding India' has served close to over 9.5 million people.



Through his relentless efforts, Ankit has been appointed as one of United Nation's 17 Young Leaders for the Sustainable Development Goals from across the world. He was selected from over 18,000 nominations from 186 different countries. On November 30, 2016 Ankit Kwatra from India was honored with the Queen's Young Leaders award in UK for his exceptional work in transforming the lives of others and making a lasting difference in the communities. On April 13 2017, Ankit Kwatra achieved another breakthrough after he was named in the Forbes Under 30 lists in the Social Entrepreneurs category from India.

Feeding India has few main projects through which it serves food to the beneficiaries:

a). **Poshan to Paathshala** : Through this program, Feeding India works to ensure that vulnerable children from the unprivileged section of the society get access to proper education during their childhood by providing them food on a regular basis and tracking their nutritional intake.

b). **Magic Truck**: The Feeding India Magic Truck Program is a program that ensures a 24 X 7 running vehicle that collects and redistributes excess food to people in dire need. Magic Truck collects these large quantities of food especially from functions, cafeterias, events, etc. and serves meals to target beneficiaries while maintaining ensuring proper quality of the food.

c). **Hunger Hero Program**: Feeding India works with more than 7,500 volunteers in 55 cities to redistribute excess food to people in need and spread awareness about no food wastage. Feeding India volunteers are called Hunger Heroes. In 2017, Feeding India Hunger Heroes (the volunteers) have served 3,028,720 meals to people in need.



The beneficiaries primarily include children below 15 years to curb the malnutrition, mentally retarded, physically disabled and pregnant women to which it provides nutritious meals two times a day and monitor their increase in nutrition levels and health. Feeding India also identifies and makes full effort to provide rehabilitation to the abandoned senior citizens, women and children. This includes providing meals, medical facilities and other day to day needs.

Keshav Mahavidyalaya is one such college under Delhi University that is fully funded by Delhi Government and has made interesting strides in the field of academics, research and produced promising alumni making the college proud. The college can boast of its promising alumni with many passed out students of the college working at respectable positions in some of the leading corporates & some are very successful in their own start-ups so much that they have won international accolades for their work, and Ankit Kwatra is one of them.

## Mobile App for School Management Committees

Around 16,000 members of different school management committees (SMCs) will now be able to connect with each other, officials and carry out their operations using a mobile application. The app is aimed at helping the schools, parents and students in better coordination and result-oriented performance. The SMC app was launched by Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia at Indira Gandhi Stadium in the presence of over 16000 SMC members.

"We have done an experiment towards democratisation of school education system in Delhi. Our effort is to make the SMC members realise that they are the owners of the schools and will contribute their services for betterment of quality of education," Arvind Kejriwal said at the event.

Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia announced that with the new budget next year, Rs 3-4 lakh will be allocated by the Govt to each SMC for development purpose. He said, "The SMC was created for the betterment of teaching and learning process in schools, and to ensure community participation."

CM said, "Education is the topmost priority for the AAP govt. In the past 2 years, a revolution has been brought about in the education sector of Delhi, for which the credit goes to the teachers, principals, the education dept and, most of all, the members of the SMC."

## Over 30,000 Govt school teachers to be trained in English

Around 50 mentor teachers and others will coach 30,000 government school teachers and break the myths around language learning. These mentor teachers of the Directorate of



Education and faculty members of District Institute of Education and Training (DIET) participated in the 15-day foundational course on English language at State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT). The course was organized by the Education Department in partnership with Regional English Language Office (RELO) of the US Embassy to launch a certificate programme for its teachers on Teaching of English to Students of Other Language (TESOL). The next two rounds of the training will be through an online training module.

The government-initiated the first phase of 15-day foundational course in a tie-up with the regional English language office of the US embassy as

well as assistant professors of curriculum and pedagogy from the George Washington University. The learning course is conducted through face to face conversations, reading and viewing assignments, online discussion and individual and small group projects. Students will be encouraged to post questions and comments on any issues related to the teaching of English.

Resource persons Dr Sarah Sahr and Dr Lottie Baker said that Delhi can inspire countries like Mexico, Uruguay, Iran, Korea and the United States, to learn from these teachers. I encouraged them by saying, "Without your efforts, education is going to stay the same. With your efforts, standards of education are going to soar."

## Dual VET Training for 364 ITI trainees



One month long in-plant training on the lines of Dual Vocational Educational Training (VET) was accorded to 364 Second year Electrician trade students studying in Delhi Govt ITIs on the pattern of German Modul. The training conducted in 33 Industries by Tata Strive & Siemens focused on employment, entrepreneurship and community enterprise.

Tata Strive and Siemens have collaborated with DTTE in 2016 to improve quality of training in ITIs with Dual VET programme. Dual VET is a German Methodology where training is interlocked with theory and workshop, integrated with soft skill, life skills and work place readiness module.

- **Insurance & PPE:** Insurance of all the students was done before in-plant training. They were issued with PPE (Safety gears).
- **Safety training:** Safety training was conducted for all the students to create an awareness regarding importance of safety in organization.

Around 33 companies came forward under Dual VET allowing the trainees to receive hands on training on the latest machinery giving them real time work place exposure.

The trainees from 11 ITIs namely ITI-AKS, ITI Shahdara, ITI Dheerpur, ITI Malvia Nagar, ITI Jail Road, ITI Jaffarpur, ITI Pusa, ITI Jahangir Puri, ITI



Mayur Vihar, ITI Nananagri, ITI Narela were given project based time bound activities and training on different electrical equipments, power distribution stations, high intensity cables in plants, electronic systems and hardware to make them skilful and Industry compatible.



The training helped the students to gain more confidence, became more responsible and learned various jobs and different functions in the organization they were placed. As the learning mode was more practical, the trainees were exposed to the critical aspects of working in an organisation. On the completion of training, out of 33 companies, most of the organisations/companies have expressed their interest to be part of such inclusive and exclusive training programme in future and look forward to get the skilled manpower from the technical institutes trained under Dual VET model.

### 'SCHOOLS OF EXCELLENCE' FOR QUALITY EDUCATION

The Delhi Cabinet has cleared the proposal to set up a new category of schools called the 'Schools of Excellence' where the medium of education will be English. The admissions to these schools will begin next year.

As per the criteria, children living in the neighborhood area of the school will be given preference in the admission to these schools and they also have to appear for a written test. As of now, five such schools were ready in the areas Dwarka, Khichdipur, Madanpur Khadar, Kalkaji and Rohini. Other than modern infrastructure, the important feature of these schools will be that maximum number of students per section will not be more than 25.

### SKILL CENTRE

The Delhi Cabinet also has approved the setting up of a world-class skill development centre in Jaunapur area of South West Delhi. The centre will be completed in the coming two years and Rs 254 crore has been approved for it.

Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia said that initially the first phase of the Skill Centre will come up for giving skill training to 5000 students in hospitality, food processing, logistics, electronics, retail merchandising, IT enabled services and other sectors. Eighty Five per cent of seats in the said centre will be reserved for the Delhi based students. The admission process will begin after two years as the centre comes into existence. He also said that the government was planning 25 more skill centres and a skill development campus that will have all the modern labs and infrastructure for various skills.

### INDUSTRY MEET (INDUS-2017)

With a view to create an enabling atmosphere for entrepreneurship and skill development, Ambedkar Institute of Advanced Communication Technologies (AIACTR) organized an Industry Meet (INDUS-2017) at



the college premises on December 14. Over 40 Industries/companies participated in this event and assured their full support to the college with regard to setting up an IT Park, placements for the students, providing inputs in designing the industry relevant curriculum focused on skill development and opportunities for the budding entrepreneurs. This will also enable the faculty and students of AIACTR to design and develop the Electronics and IT related Hardware and Software products for industry as well as for the common people addressing the social cause. The Industries expressed their willingness to sponsor and help the Incubation cell to design the products for common people at an affordable cost. The proposed IT Park will not only provide the internships and training to students but will be very useful for placement of students and to faculty for carrying out joint research.

# School bodies to get money, say in teach

**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi government on Thursday announced that it will empower school management committees (SMCs) further by allocating additional funds to them to be used for academic and extra-curricular purposes in the next budget.

Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal also suggested that SMCs should be authorised to hire teachers on a temporary basis, until the department can fill the vacant posts.

Manish Sisodia, the education minister of Delhi, along with CM Kejriwal, made the announcement while interacting with the 16,000 newly elected SMC members and launching an app to facilitate their functioning at Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium on Thursday.

"Till now the SMCs and the Vidyalaya Kalyan Samiti (VKS) that worked in the morning shift school would get Rs 4 lakh, and those in the evening shift would get Rs 3 lakh... We are now creating a scheme, which will be a part of the next budget, under which every school's SMC will get Rs 4-4 lakh, based on the number of students they have," said Sisodia.

Atish Marwaha, the advisor to Sisodia, told HT that this would be an addition to the VES funds that schools already receive.

"The evening shift schools get very little funds when compared to the morning shift ones. Also, the VES funds are only meant to be used for infrastructural needs. The additional funds can be utilised for academic purposes and extra-curricular activities."
